PASTOR'S DESK

From the Desk of Father Dan

Recently, Bishop Fernandes has approved new directives for the distribution of the Precious Blood at Mass. You may recall that this past spring, people were able to receive



Communion from the cup that was offered at one Mass on the weekend. The opportunity to receive under both species has now been increased. Basically, the cup may be offered at Sunday Masses, Solemnities, and Feasts. Also, the Precious Blood may be offered on special occasions like First Communions, Confirmations, Weddings; but it is not to be offered at Mass every day. Receiving Communion under both species is a clearer sign of the Eucharist, but remember that a person receives the entire Eucharist under one species.

In order for the parish to increase the opportunities to receive from the cup, we need to have a schedule of Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist who are dependable, rather than the current situation where people just come up out of the congregation. I appreciate their willingness to serve, but often their attire is not appropriate for a minister of the Eucharist. We have to know that ministers are available before we plan on distributing Communion under both species.

Another consideration is that the Diocese is mandating a special training session for Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist before we increase the number of Masses in which we will distribute the cup. So, we should recommission the veteran ministers, as well as recruit new ones. There will be a sign-up sheet in the vestibule for this purpose. Only those who sign up will be put on the list to be commissioned and be scheduled for Masses.

Here are the qualifications for Extraordinary Ministers of Eucharist:

- Fully initiated Catholics (baptized and confirmed)
- Registered member of St. Timothy Parish
- If married, you should have been married according to Catholic marriage laws.
- You are living as an active Catholic, faithful to the teachings of the church.
- Willing to be scheduled to serve and be responsible to fulfill the commitment.
- If unable to attend a Mass for which you have been scheduled, you will find a substitute minister to replace you.

The sign-up sheet is in the vestibule.

Local food pantries have been struggling to keep up with the significant increase in people needing food after Ohio households received a sharp reduction in the size of their benefits under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) in March. More than 80% of SNAP beneficiaries are working families and individuals with disabilities or elderly people. The reduction of SNAP benefits, along with the rising costs of food, has been a hardship for Ohio families living paycheck to paycheck or trying to make ends meet on a fixed income.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) is helping families with food insecurity with the food pantry located at the St. James the Less Church at 1614 Oakland Park in North Linden. Volunteers from parishes throughout the diocese pack groceries each evening, Monday through Friday. The SVDP Conference at St. Timothy contributes financial support and provides teams that volunteer at the St. James Pantry to supply groceries to over 800 needy clients each month.

The St. James Food Pantry is located in a Food desert or an urban area in which it is difficult to buy affordable or good quality fresh food. Many clients do not have the transportation to get to a grocery store which is miles away. The pantry provides healthy meals for the families in this impoverished neighborhood.

Each week, the SVDP conference at St. Timothy collects your nonperishable food items for the St. James Food Pantry in the grocery cart in the church vestibule. The pantry is currently in need of the following food supplies:

- Soup and crackers
- Coffee
- Packaged meals such as Hamburger Helper or butter noodles.
