PASTOR'S DESK

From the Desk of Father Dan

I'm really trying to work on increasing effective communication in the parish. Specifically, we struggle to get information

about events that various parish organizations are sponsoring or hosting. This applies to the weekly bulletin as well as to announcements made at the end of Mass. The other part of communication is the responsibility of meeting deadlines for the parish office to publicize these events. Please be aware of these deadlines: material for the coming week's bulletin should be communicated (phone call, email, or personal visit) to the administrative assistant, John Tuttle, by Monday of that week. Pulpit announcements are more limited. Announcements are only made if there is some response needed as you leave Mass. If a requested announcement meets this standard, please contact the office by Friday morning. Otherwise, it should be sent to the office in time for the bulletin. Thanks for your cooperation in this.

Lenten Information: Masses on Ash Wednesday are at 9:00 a.m., 1:00 p.m. (School Mass), and 6:00 p.m. Parishioners are welcome to attend any of these three Masses. There will not be Adoration on Ash Wednesday. Stations of the Cross will be on Friday evenings, at 6:00 p.m., including Good Friday.

Fasting and Abstinence Regulations: All persons who are 14 and older are expected to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and on the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is expected for those 14 to 59. Fasting allows only one full meal and two lighter meals in the course of the day and prohibits eating between meals. There are exceptions to this regulation: pregnant women and people who are sick are not obliged to fast. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. The self-discipline of fasting and abstinence is intended to help us to manage our spiritual self-discipline.

Something to think about: Sometimes people tell me that abstaining from meat is no sacrifice because they love seafood so much. Maybe then, another act of sacrifice should be part of one's spiritual preparation for Easter. "Giving up" something for Lent should be important enough for the person that he or she recognizes the sacrifice being made.
